


## CEMETERY CHAPEL'S RENOVATIONS BEGIN...

## 2019/20 BUDGET STATEMENT

The precept for 2019/20 will be increased by 15% being £172,141.00. This equates to a yearly cost of £131.81 to Band D Tax properties. This is largely due to the fact that the DMBC grant received by Stainforth Town Council has been reduced by £16,014.00. It is hopeful that a number of initiatives will take place within this financial year including more Christmas lighting, youth working services, new town signs, development of the Recreation Ground and

investment in a new community building. The Clerk wishes to point out that the reduction in the DMBC grant is part of a scheme to removing it all together in 2021 and this needs to be taken into account over the next financial year.

A 15% increase accounts for the full amount of the grant money lost.



# SERV PUTS PETAL TO THE METAL



If you haven't heard, seen or noticed Stainforth Environmental Regeneration Volunteers (SERV) in Stainforth then you must be living under a rock! They have become the heart and soul of making our town a cleaner and a greener place to live. As well as campaigning for 20 new litter bins, collecting around 5,000 bags of rubbish since starting. SERV have recently placed six new planters to keep Stainforth in bloom! They are located at Asda, Stainforth's marketplace corner, S4ALL Community Library,

Little Mim's Café and at Harbour Lights. SERV also rose to the occasion and rejuvenated previous planters and flowerbeds injecting some life back into them. These include flower beds and planters at Stanley Gardens, Windsor Road, Victoria Close and outside the Old Village Café. As well new flower beds an extra three new litter bins are being donated by River & Canal Trust. These are planned to be located along the canal at the Central Car Park, West Bank and Ramskir Lane on the bank near the farm house.





# HISTORY



This picture was taken in 1891 of St Matthew's approximately 128 years ago! Built in 1819 on Field Road it was the third church in the history of Stainforth and this became the Parish Church. This church has been uncomplimentary described as a 'brick barn-looking chapel looking exactly like a Nonconformist Chapel' and the 'ugliest church in England'. The last wedding at this old Stainforth Parish Church was rather unusual. Mr J Shearer, a former chief engineer at Hatfield Main Colliery, had been seriously ill and he arrived at the church in an ambulance accompanied by Dr Anderson. He was carried into and out of church on a stretcher and then returned home in the ambulance. The old church continued to be used as the Church Hall until 1966, when, because of increasing maintenance costs and poor condition, it was demolished; Field Road Surgery is now built on the site of the old church.
