I had the honour of representing the people of Stainforth at events elsewhere such as the thanksgiving services of the Mayors of Doncaster and Hatfield. I have represented the town council at the annual Remembrance service in church and at the cenotaph in November.

I chose to raise funds for Stainforth's Food Bank and raised £75. I used the council's newsletter, Stainforth Voice, to appeal to the community for help with giving food to the food bank.

I am pleased that the town council has continued to help organisations in Stainforth which are helping the community. This help can make a difference between making an event viable or not. I am also pleased that we have continued with our stickers, Please Slow Down In Our Town, to help raise awareness for motorists of our road safety campaign.

Early on we lost two members of the town council One was due to increased pressure from his business which entailed a great deal of travel but, sadly, the other was due to antisocial behaviour of an extreme nature which meant that her house lost every window in the house. I also opened a lively children's Christmas party at Saint Mary's and have accompanied our PCSOs on a crime prevention morning in our local supermarket. It was a great pleasure to be invited to the relaunch of Stainforth library by Stainforth4All along with our M.P. Ed. Miliband and the Mayor of Doncaster, Mrs Ros. Jones. I also took part in a documentary film which is being made about Stainforth's rebirth after the miners' strike. At all the above events I received a warm welcome.

MAYOR'S REPORT 2016-17

The precept this year is £178,985, which includes a grant of £42,905 from DMBC, but despite the rise we are in the fortunate position of being able to charge community charge payers less because there are more contributors paying into the pot owing to new housing in the parish.

I should also like to repeat my thanks for the dedication of the staff in the office and in the cemetery.

I wish my successor well and hope the council will unite around her.





A plus side of this development is that approximately 12 people from the area are working on the development the majority of these are from Stainforth.


The road names for this development have already been chosen and include Briars LANE, Greenfield Road and Chalk Road.



PATIENT PARTICIPATION GROUP

There have been complaints about people being unable to get appointments early in the morning or after normal surgery hours in an evening. It is now possible to register for the surgery's online service. This allows patients to book appointments in advance and order repeat prescriptions without visiting the surgery.

If you have a computer and get on to the internet, why not visit the surgery and pick up a registration form. You MUST take with you two forms of identity, one of then MUST have a recent photograph -this could be your driving licence or bus pass, the other should be a recent utilities' bill as proof of your address.

Further to the above, every month people are booking appointments to see a doctor or nurse but failing to keep them. This is wasting valuable time that could be better used by members of the surgery staff and patients.

To try to reduce the number of missed appointments the surgery now sends a text message to remind patients of the date and time of their appointment, to

assist the staff to make more efficient

use of their time.

If you have Not registered your mobile phone number why not do it NOW.

Another problem caused by missed appointments is the cost implications for the surgery, with all the government cut backs it is IMPERATIVE that the surgery staff maximise the time that doctors and nurses are available.

700 Hundred Years Of Market History

Stainforth 4 ALL community centre has been given Stainforth's 700 hundred year old Market Charter to display proudly.

In 1348, Stainforth market received a Royal Charter, entitling it to hold a weekly market on Fridays and an annual ten-day fair.

The town briefly thrived as a commercial centre and port and attracted traders from as far afield as the Isle of Axholme, but the market soon slumped as Bawtry grew in importance.







STAINFORTH MARKET CHARTER 24th Jan. 1348

Grant to Edmund De Lingele the King's Son and his heirs of a weekly market on Friday at the Town of Staymford, Co. Yorks., and of a yearly Fair there on the Bigil and the Day of the Nativity of the Virgin and eight days following.

From the Rolls of Edward 3rd, transcribed from a photocopy supplied by the Public Record Office

The King to the same greetings know that we have granted and by this our charter confirmed to Lidmund de Langele our most dear Son that he and his heirs habe foreber a market each week on Friday at the bille of Staynford in the County of York and a Hair there each year lasting for ten days bix on the Bigil and on the Heast of the Nativity of The Blessed Mary the Pirgin and the eight days next following unless that market and fair are at the annoyance of the neighbouring fairs wherefore I will and firmly command for us and our heirs to you and your heirs market and fair at the bille aforesaid with all the liberties and freecustoms belonging to the kind of market and fair unless that market be to the annoyance of neighbouring markets and fairs as is foresaid these witness The Benerable Fathers John Archbishop of Canterbury Brimate of All England The Bishop of London The Bishop of Chichester Henry Earl of Lancaster Karl of of Northampton Magister John de Our Chancellor Robert Talbot who is Steward of our hospital and other given by our

s manors which included Hatfield and Stainforth. The Manors reverted to the Crown and mained Crown Property until Vermuyden bought the manors. The Market rights then mained with the successive Lords of the Manor until all manorial rights were extinguished by the 1811 Thorne Hatfield and Fishlake Enclosure and the Award of 1825 when all manorial perogatives became the properties and rights of the commoners vested in the Town's Commi until the local government act setting up Parish Council.




